Due to the increasing number of confirmed cases of West Nile Virus, this bulletin will only be updated on a weekly basis.

October 22, 2009

The total count as of today's date for confirmed West Nile Virus cases in horses is seventy (70) of the seventy (70), thirty five (35) horses have died. No new counties have been added.

September 25, 2009

The total count as of today's date for confirmed West Nile Virus cases in horses is sixty three (63) of the sixty three (63), thirty one (31) horses have died. No new counties have been added.

September 18, 2009

The total count as of today's date for confirmed West Nile Virus cases in horses is fifty eight (58) of the fifty eight (58), twenty seven (27) horses have died. The counties with confirmed cases are as follows: Benton, Yakima, Kittitas, Adams, Grant, and Franklin.

September 11, 2009

The total count as of today's date for confirmed West Nile Virus cases in horses is fifty one (51) of the fifty one (51), twenty four (24) horses have died. The counties with confirmed cases are as follows: Benton, Yakima, Kittitas, Adams, Grant, and Franklin.

September 1, 2009

Due to the increasing number of confirmed cases of West Nile Virus, this bulletin will only be updated on a weekly basis.

The total count as of today's date for confirmed West Nile Virus cases in horses is thirty two (32) of the thirty two (32), eighteen (18) horses have died. The counties with confirmed cases are as follows: Benton, Yakima, Kittitas, Adams, and Grant.

August 14, 2009

Three more cases of West Nile Virus, for a total of 12 horses, was reported to Dr. Paul Kohrs, Assistant State Veterinarian.

A 15-year-old, Quarter Horse mare in the Teton area was unvaccinated and was euthanized.

A 11-year-old, Quarter Horse mare in the Ellensburg area was unvaccinated and was euthanized.

A 3-year-old Quarter Horse Paint mix in the Kennewick area was unvaccinated and was euthanized.

August 13, 2009

Four new cases of West Nile Virus were reported from the Washington Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory.

A 4-year-old, Quarter Horse cross stallion in the Grandview area was unvaccinated and was euthanized.

A 3-year-old, male, pony, in the Toppenish area was unvaccinated and was euthanized.

A 4-year-old, Quarter Horse female, in the Naches area was unvaccinated and was euthanized.

A 9-year-old, gelding, pony, in the Yakima area was euthanized even though it was vaccinated one week before showing signs of WNV.

August 7, 2009

Two cases of West Nile Virus were reported today. The horses had not been vaccinated for West Nile Virus.

The 5-year-old Quarter Horse gelding from Othello has made a slight recovery.

The 4-year-old Quarter Horse gelding from Kennewick was euthanized.

July 31, 2009

A third case of West Nile Virus was reported today. The horse had not been vaccinated for West Nile Virus. The 1-year-old Quarter Horse gelding from Ellensburg was euthanized.

July 27, 2009

Dr. Paul Kohrs, Assistant Washington State Veterinarian, reported two case of West Nile Virus on the 24th. Neither horse had been vaccinated for West Nile Virus.

The 9-year-old Quarter Horse gelding from Prosser appears to be recovering. The 8-year-old Quarter Horse mare from Toppenish was euthanized.
